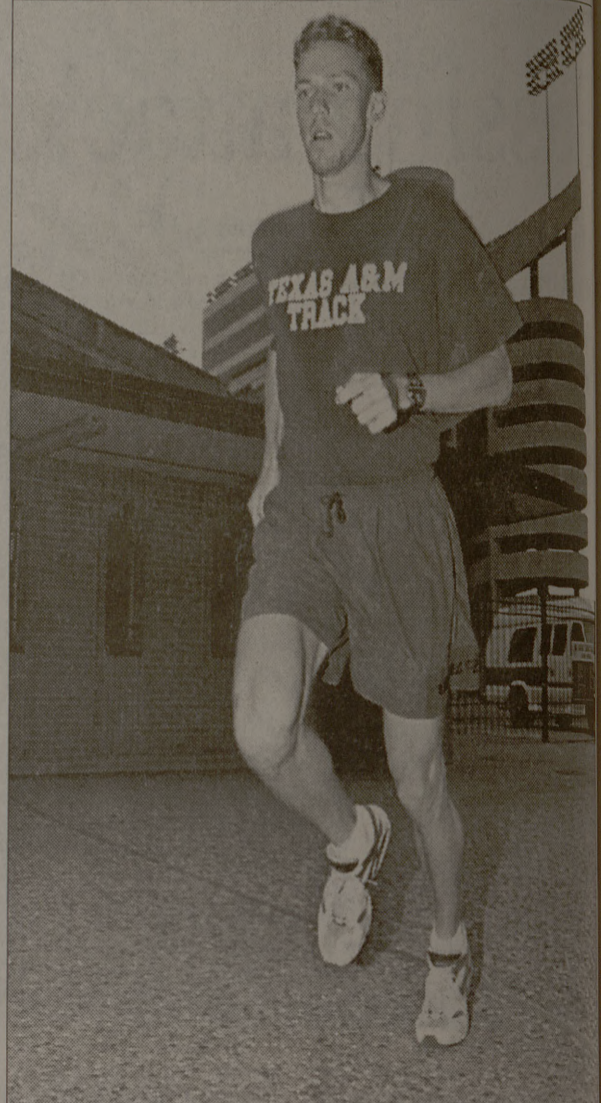

## Priest has faith in final SWC meet

After running over 3,000 miles in the last year, Texas A&M cross country runner Matt Priest is not tired. Instead he is peaking for the Southwest Conference Cross Country Championships beginning today in Waco.

"I've been shooting for this all year," Priest said. "It's hard to be spectacular early if you want to be spectacular late. I think you have to run 10 to 15 miles a day. You have to work all year and shoot for a couple of months."

Even though Priest's performance earlier this season was not spectacular by his standards, it was still pretty good. In the four meets Priest has entered this season, he has finished second in three of them.

"You really can't dwell on a meet in early September," Priest said. "You have to time everything right and not peak too early. The key is getting rest because you are going to be in shape for the race. Right now, I'm in the best shape of my life."

Last year, Priest finished fourth at the SWC meet and made it to the NCAA Championships as an individual qualifier.

"He's doing really well this year," Texas A&M Cross Country Coach Greg Hinze said. "Sometimes runners think it's their birthright to get back to the NCAA's. But Matt hasn't approached it that way at all."

Priest said he approaches it differently because of the way he feels about running.

"I definitely have a love for the sport," Priest said. "Cross country is a great opportunity

to see the outdoors. You are out there running with nature instead of in a track.

"It's a different kind of high because you're not running circles. You always looking down a path, viewing where you need to be. It's more challenging running on the hills and in the mud than it is just running laps."

Right now the challenge for the favored Priest is the SWC

Championships.

"All I want to do is step onto the course and know that there is nothing I could have done different for the race," Priest said. "We're (he and the other top contestants) at very close, so I'm going hard to do it right. I'd say this race is probably 75 percent mental."

"I don't have to win. I just have to race better than I've had before. That's life."

## Soccer team takes two in Florida

Bryn Blalack's goal in the 109th minute lifted Texas A&M to a 1-0 overtime victory over Central Florida at the UCF Soccer Complex on Sunday afternoon.

A&M, now 16-4-0 and ranked 10th nationally, outshout UCF 26-3.

With four minutes gone by in the second overtime period, Blalack controlled a rebound near the back post and fired home the game-winner from eight yards out.

Freshman forward Nicole Shooks scored two goals to lead the Texas A&M Soccer Team to a 3-2 victory over the 21st-ranked University of Florida Friday in Gainesville.

"A lot can be said for this team's ability to come back after being down 2-0 against a Top 25 team on the road in front of a large, boisterous crowd," Guertner said. "This win was good for us. It shows that we can come back from a tough defeat at SMU against a good solid team like Florida."

The Aggies now take the rest of the week off from playing in preparation for the Southwest Conference Tournament.

## Rice passes Lofton in receiving yards

□ The 49ers' star is now in first place all-time with 14,040 yards.

San Francisco (AP) — On the day he became the NFL's career leader in receiving yards, Jerry Rice was thinking only about the pass he didn't catch.

Rice had eight receptions for 108 yards Sunday, bringing his career total to 14,040 yards and surpassing James Lofton's mark of 14,000 yards.

But Rice was upset at himself for failing to catch a bomb from Elvis Grbac late in the San Francisco 49ers' 11-7 loss to the New Orleans Saints. The pass went off the fingertips of Rice, who was tightly covered by cornerback Jimmy Spencer.

"The ball was up there and I

knew I had to explode for the ball," Rice said. "I had to use so much energy to catch up to the ball. I had my hands on it, and if you have your hands on it you should get the ball."

The long pass came with about 2:30 remaining in the game and the 49ers facing a third-and-18 at the New Orleans 49. San Francisco punted on the next play and never got the ball back.

"I should have made the catch," Rice said. "If I would have made it, we would have won the football game."

After the catch, 49ers fullback William Floyd hugged Rice and pointed to the huge stadium screen flashing news of the record to fans. Floyd then bowed to Rice as referee Larry Nemmers announced to the crowd: "Congratulations to Jerry Rice on breaking the all-time receiving record in the National Football League."

The game was stopped momentarily, but the celebration didn't last long — Grbac threw an interception two plays later.

Lofton played 16 seasons for Green Bay, the Los Angeles Raiders, Buffalo, the Los Angeles Rams and Philadelphia.
