Brown will not travel to Oak-

land for Sunday's game against the Raiders, Daniels said. Rookie Alundis Brice, a fourth-round draft choice with one interception to his credit in limited play, will substitute for Brown.




Price has seen some action this year at defensive back, his natural position. Against the University of Houston this season, Price picked off his first career past.

After posting impressive finished in last weekend's Reveille Invitational, the Texas A&M Men's and Women's Swimming and Diving Teams will continue home action today when they host the Louisiana State University Tigers.

The event will begin at 2 p.m. at the Student Recreational Center Natatorium.

The Tiger men enter Friday's meet coming off of a 142-95 dual meet win over Northeast Louisiana last Saturday while the Lady Tigers are coming off an 89-153 loss to the University of Alabama on Nov. 4.

Last week the 18thrankėd Lady Aggies captured the women's team crown with 821.50 points, besting No. 3 Texas by 58.5 They captured 11 first-

place awards on the weekend led by sophomore Stacie Karnes victory in the 500meter free style in the first event of the weekend.

The A&M men picked up four firsts and several close seconds in their second-place

Lone senior Scott DeWolf scored a victory in the 200-fly while Kyle Marden won the 200-breast and Jason Miles took first in the 1650-free.

The Texas A&M Soccer Team is hoping the third time is the charm.

Saturday in Dallas, the Aggies will take on No. 3 Southern Methodist University in a second-round NCAA Tournament game beginning at 2 p.m.

The Aggies opened their first-ever NCAA Tournament appearance with a 4-1 win over No. 16 Clemson last Sunday at the Aggie Soccer Complex.

A&M is 0-2 against SMU this season, losing 3-1 on Oct. 25 in the clash for the Southwest Conference regular-season title, then 4-2 in overtime on Nov. 5 in the championship match of the SWC Tournament.


A&M comes into the game ranked No. 10 in the final Soccer America poll with an 18-5 record. Along with Maryland, A&M is the only team making its first appearance in the NCAA Tournament to still be in the running.

Homefield advantage is definitely favoring the Mustangs on Saturday. SMU is a stellar 10-0-1 at Wescott Field while the Aggies are only 4-3 on the road.

But the Aggies do have some momentum on their side. SMU has never won an NCAA Tournament match — going 0-3 in their previous appearances in the postseason.

The Aggies are hoping junior forward Yvette Okler will continue her hot streak in the postseason against SMU.

In last Sunday's win over Clemson, Okler was two-oftwo on shots on goal.
