major, said she is not confident that the speed limit increase was a wise move.

"When the speed limit was 55, people went 70 anyway, so now they will probably go 80," Duna-gin said. "It would have probably been better to just continue being lenient with the 55 speed limit than to change it.'

Carmon said the primary purpose of the change was not a desire for faster driving speeds, but rather a shift in decision-making power from the federal to the state governments.
