

Clyde Drexler led the Rockets with 23 points and



Mayor Bob Lanier on Monday id he is negotiating with the ckets to build a new arena for e NBA team near the downwn George Brown Convention enter. The Rockets still have ght years to run on their lease ith the city-owned Summit, but e mayor thought there was a

good chance a deal could be made. "I feel reasonably optimistic," he said.

Lanier declined to provide details, other than to say the convention center would share in the benefits and cost of such a venture.

The Rockets franchise would not comment. "That's the position we've tak-

en on this," spokeswoman Kathy Frietsch said. Lanier made his mission known in his annual State of the

City address before the Greater Houston Partnership, where he repeated themes that handily clinched 83 percent of the vote last November.


