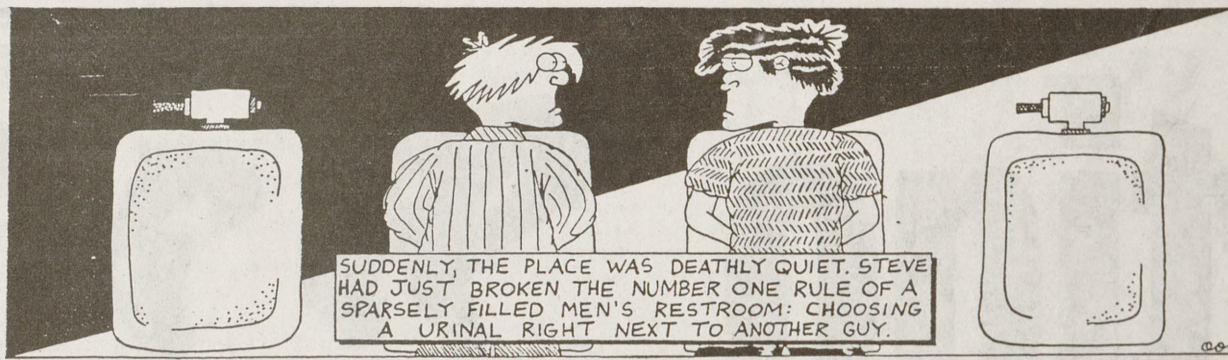

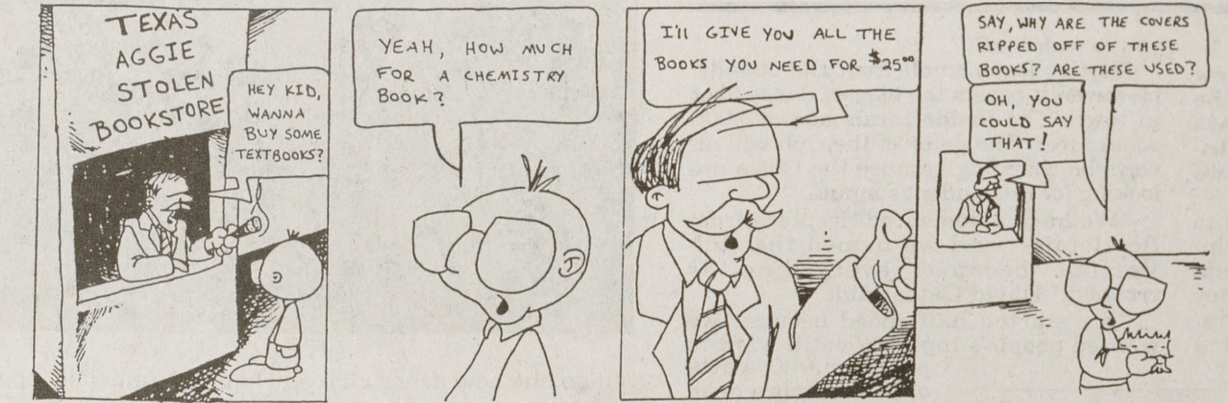

during football weekends when (the regents) were in session," McBeth said.  
Employees at the Center for Diversity Education said they were warned by Commissioner of Education that smoke fumes were often overwhelming when the regents were in town.  
A former student worker wishes to remain anonymous and said that it was common for West and her assistant to smoke in the regents' office.  
The student also said that West often called breaks during meetings so that she could get the office and have a cigarette.  
Burgess said he thinks the regents should have to follow University policy like everyone else.  
"If they are going to set these rules," he said, "they need to learn to play by them."  
University policy does permit smoking on campus in most outside areas.
