

Utility Rates: City offers free energy audits Rent

improvements and other expenses, Calliham said, but the city is giving away more than ever before to citizens. The city used to retain 60 percent of savings.

The average residential customer paid \$81.74 per month for utility bills in 1986 but will pay only \$67.43 per month at the 1996 rates.

Calliham said the rate reduction

should dispel the myth that College Station's utilities are more expensive than those of Bryan and other Texas cities.

Even before the rate reduction, College Station residents were paying slightly less for 1,000 kilowatt hours of electricity than Bryan residents, Calliham said.

The reduction will widen the gap even further.

"I hope the perception will change, because the rates definitely have," Calli-

ham said.

Somehow, despite the decreased electricity rates, some students find themselves paying more than the residential average every month.

Calliham said those students should contact the city's energy conservation office at 764-3724 for a free energy audit.

"We feel an obligation to encourage students to call our energy office to let us help them as to why their energy bill is high," she said.
