 editor, said that the SSFAC's recommendation's should not be passed.  
 "Members of the SSFAC, the GSC and the Student Senate Internal Affairs Committee have all acknowledged that the SSFAC's current recommendation is a flawed document," he said. "For each of these organizations to support such a document is inexcusable."  
 "The MSC is being asked to pay for a SSFAC miscalculation, and The Battalion is being told it should accept a 94-percent decrease because last year's SSFAC allocated more money than was available. If the Senate and the GSC choose to support this document, the message is being sent that 'everything's OK.' And that is far from the truth."

 Student Financial Aid, said the programs have been tremendously successful because of the Association's generosity.  
 "It's certainly great for the Association to contribute directly to benefiting students," Bormann said. "We are certainly very grateful for all that the Association has done."  
 During the 1994 academic

year, 2,200 students took advantage of the loan program, borrowing in excess of \$1.3 million.  
 The Association also awarded 300 students scholarships, valued at \$275,000.  
 Bormann said the figures should be similar for this academic year.  
 The Association also has provided funding for the Scholarship Resource Center, which is used by more than 4,000 students each year.  
 Steven Roy, a history graduate student, said he has accumulated about \$12,000 in student loans,

but was unaware that the Association helped to fund scholarships and student loans.  
 Roy said that although he thinks the services are beneficial to students, the loan program would not be one of his priorities.  
 "I'm all right in the short term, so I would not need a loan," Roy said. "I'd be more interested in scholarships."

**Tolerance is not enough.**

**Dr. Martin Luther King Jr.'s dream** was that one day blacks and whites would not merely tolerate each other, but live together in mutual love and respect.

**He admitted the challenges** of this dream, "It is pretty difficult to like some people. Like is sentimental and it is pretty difficult to like someone bombing your home; it is pretty difficult to like somebody threatening your children; it is difficult to like congressmen who spend all of their time trying to defeat civil rights. But Jesus says love them, and love is greater than like."


**What motivated him** were these words from Jesus: "Love your enemies, do good to those who hate you, bless those who curse you, pray for those who abuse you. If you love those who love you, what credit is that to you? But love your enemies, and do good and your reward will be great, and you will be sons of the Most High; for he is kind to the ungrateful and selfish."

**With a commitment to love** even his enemies, Dr. King led an historic civil rights movement without any violence or vengeance.

As he said, "...We must be concerned about...the sacredness of all human life. Every man is somebody because he is a child of God."

**Why is tolerance not enough?** You can tolerate people without loving them. But loving them is what will defeat racism.
