# Rugged Rangers enjoying extra spring in their steps

Coaches are hoping intense workouts will lead to a tougher drive on the field.

PORT CHARLOTTE, Fla. (AP) — Intense daily workouts that have left players gasping for breath have made Rangers conditioning coach Tim Lang the least popular man in the clubhouse this spring.

With players, that is. The manager, on the other hand, loves him.

"Tim is doing a good job of making these guys mad," Johnny Oates said, chuckling. "They're working hard. Physically, this is the toughest major league camp I've ever seen — and the players are putting a lot of effort into it, too."

Reliever Mike Henneman griped, "I only need to go in and throw 12 pitches!"

Darren Oliver, who spent the off-season working out strenuously, said, "The first day of this, I thought I was going to die."

Oates said all of this is directly toward healthy players, something the Rangers didn't have

much of last season. Oates said he vowed to remedy the situation the day that camp opened.

"This is the year for the Texas Rangers to stay healthy," Oates is quoted as saying in The Dallas Morning News. "We keep expecting it and expecting it and it doesn't happen. Even when I was on the other side, you'd look at Texas and say, 'Why do they have all those serious injuries?'"

Oates said staff members are turning over every stone to find a possible answer.

Lang said they're just not hoping to prevent injuries, they're planning it.

"The trainers and the doctors and I sat down and tried to make modifications to our stretching, our warmups and our conditioning programs to get the players used to the movement and the activities that they will experience dur-

ing the season," he said.

Some injuries, like the biceps muscle that kept Lang Palmer out most of last season, are accidents. But others, like the back injury that placed Gonzalez on the disabled list 33 games, can be avoided.

"Juan realizes what he has to do," Lang said. "And he's been very diligent, working with a medicine ball and working on abdominals, doing all the things he needs to do. I've been impressed with his approach."

Even workout enthusiasts like starters Bobby Witt and Roger Pavlik struggled early on. Witt learned the importance of conditioning from another Rangers pitcher, Nolan Ryan.

"I always liked working after watching him," Witt said. "Seeing that type of person, that, and the success he had in the longevity, shows the importance of continuing to exercise."

The Rangers nearly lost Lang in the off-season, when he decided to leave the team and move home to Chicago to be with wife, Monica. But he reconsidered, and Monica moved to the company's Dallas office.

In the classroom, Coach kept his students motivated and interested in learning the same way he did at football practice. He cared about what he was doing and he cared about his students and students picked up on that. He also concentrated on building the self-esteem and study habits of the long-haired "punks" in the back of the room wearing the Metallica T-shirts — students who were neglected in most classrooms. That's the type of guy Coach Spruill was, and that's what sets him apart from many of the coaches I ever played for.

Perhaps the main reason why my teammates and I grew to love Coach Spruill was all his goofy quirks. Everyday before practice he'd rub Ben-Gay all over his legs because of his arthritis.

He also had the annoying habit of calling play-

ers by girl names. For example, I was known as "Suzanne" throughout my varsity career. And from time to time, we'd all sit on the fieldhouse benches after practice and watch in amazement as Coach threw the javelin to one of the far off freshman fields.

But the most lasting impression I have of Coach Spruill occurred during a cold, drizzly November practice my junior season. The near-freezing weather combined with our 3-6 record headed into the last game of the season brought team morale to an all-time low.

Receivers dropping balls plagued the practice from the very start, and needless to say, Coach Spruill was beside himself. That's when he made what is now called "The Bet." For every five minutes that went by without a dropped pass, he'd take off a piece of clothing. That proved to be all the motivation we needed.

The sight of a shivering 58-year-old man wearing nothing but his boxer shorts and Nikes tends to stick with you for awhile.

Quesada and Hart and four points apiece from Anderson and junior Gary Nottingham.

A steal and a length of the court drive for a layup by Anderson extended the A&M lead to 33-22 with 9:25 remaining in the half, but as it did all night, TCU came back to grab the lead at halftime, 52-51.

A&M burst out of the gate in the second half with a 11-2 run as Nottingham scored eight straight points for the Aggies. However, the Frogs came back to tie the game at 74 with 9:40 remaining and led the rest of the way until Anderson's three-pointer tied the game at 89, setting the stage for Jacobs' heroics.

The Aggies will look to break their five-game losing streak when they return to action at Southern Methodist Saturday at 2 p.m. in Dallas.

Mike Keenan, their general manager and coach, received a five-year, \$10 million deal to leave the New York Rangers, fresh from winning the Stanley Cup, in 1994.

However, the team's ownership group ordered Keenan to cut the payroll this summer. Also, the Blues are playing at close to capacity at the year-old Kiel Center and likely couldn't quickly recoup their investment with gate receipts alone.

Keenan was out of town and unavailable for comment Monday, his secretary said.

According to reports, the elements left to clinch the deal were financial arrangements, including a new contract for Gretzky, who is making \$6.5 million this season.

"Any kind of negotiations in reading about in the paper is absurd," he said. "The reality is I don't have an answer to what I'm asking for."

Gretzky scoffed at suggestions he's seeking a new contract that would pay him \$21 million over the next three seasons.

The Cowboys can match any offers to Smith if it signed him.

"We'll just have to see on Darrin," Switzer said. Switzer said the Cowboys are paying the price for winning three Super Bowl titles in four years.

"We're paying for our success now," the coach said. "We knew it was going to happen. This is nothing unexpected."

The Cowboys have lost 21 starters to free agency in three years. Edwards joined defensive tackle Russell Maryland and cornerback Larry Brown among those cleaning out their lockers at Valley Ranch.

Maryland and Super Bowl MVP Brown signed lucrative contracts with the Oakland Raiders.

The Cowboys only have about \$2 million remaining under the salary cap and owner Jerry Jones will likely renegotiate running back Emmitt Smith's contract.
