Percy Hernandez, a Muster Committee member and senior biomedical science major, said the committee receives calls from people who think that because a student or former student donated money or

"It would be unfair to consider someone because they have donated money over another Aggie who may not have done the same types of things," Hernandez said.

"Each Aggie is special, and everyone should be treated equally."

More than 400 Muster ceremonies take place around the world, and thou-

sands of A&M students and former students gather each year to say "here" for family members and friends who have died.

Adam Landrum, a Muster Committee member and junior marketing major, said he understands how Hodges feels and that the committee has considered adding a criterion to the list to include A&M students and former students with family members who still live in the Brazos Valley.

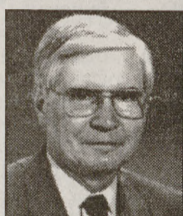
Graduating seniors must bring a signed letter from their academic advisor on departmental letterhead indicating the semester of graduation. Seats will be available for the semester of graduation only.
