Rodriguez, Rangers rock Oakland, 12-1

ARLINGTON, Texas (AP) — Ken Hill pitched a four-hitter and Ivan Rodriguez's two-run double highlighted a five-run second inning as the Texas Rangers defeated the Oakland Athletics 12-1.

Hill (3-1) walked three and struck out nine in his first career start against the A's. In pitching the Rangers first complete game this season, the right-hander, signed as a free agent in the offseason, helped Texas improve to 8-1 at home, their best start in franchise history.

Dean Palmer hit a two-run homer and Ivan Rodriguez had three hits and three RBIs for the Rangers.

The Texas A&M Softball Team continued their Texas Tech coun-


