Some Grateful Dead members are hitting the road again in their first tour together since guitarist Jerry Garcia's death.

"The Furthur Festival" tour that starts in June will feature two bands led by members of the dear depart-ed Dead: Ratdog with Bob Weir and Rob Wasserman, and percussionist Mickey Hart's Mystery Box

Also participating in the two-month, 31-city national tour: "unofficial Dead member" and keyboard player Bruce Hornsby, Los Angelesbased Latino rockers Los Lobos and Jefferson Airplane offshoot Hot Tuna.

McNally said Thursday the tour takes its name from the "Furthur" destination sign on Ken Kesey's Merry Prankster bus of the 1960s "Jerry rides with me," Hart said. "I'll be singing 'Fire on the Mountain,' one of my songs that he used

The musicians will travel by bus and perform in 15,000 to 20,000 capacity amphitheaters, structures considerably smaller than the ones the Dead performed in when Garcia, who died last August, was with them.




