Texas to file affirmative action appeal

The Attorney General is optimistic that the U.S. Supreme Court will hear the case

down the University of Texas law school's admissions policy. Ruling on a lawsuit filed by four white law school applicants, the court said UT had failed to justify favoring some

racial groups. In the wake of that ruling, higher education officials at a number of universities had stopped using race as a factor in admissions and awarding of financial aid. Texas then asked

for a stay of the ruling's effect, which the 5th Circuit granted. The stay paved the way for universities to resume, at least

temporarily, taking race into consideration in their decisions, officials said. The University of Texas and Texas A&M immediately said institutions would do so.

After the state files its appeal, the stay will remain until the court decides whether to consider the case, according to Morales spokesman Ron Dusek.

If the high court decides to hear the case, the stay will continue until the case is decided, Dusek has said. If the court does not hear the case, the stay would
