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
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

Clancy said the fund is designed for the benefit of the parents.

"Comptroller Sharp comes from a family with several children and remembers his family talking about how to afford college," Clancy said. "His family was solid mid-dle class but was too wealthy to qualify for need based scholarship and financial aid. But he had too little money to feel comfortable. The program is for middle class families like his own."

Nicole's parents, Belinda and Dana Rich, said the reasons above are why they invested in

the fund.
