



MALIBU, Calif. (AP) - Robert Downey Jr. was charged with carrying crack cocaine, heroin and an unloaded, concealed gun in his truck.

The felony charges against the 31-year-old actor, filed Tuesday, stem from speeding stop last month. He was also charged with

Epilepsy fund set in memory of Hemingway

LANDOVER, Md. (AP) — The Epilepsy Foundation of America has established a fund in memory of Margaux Hemingway, who suffered from the disease.

The 41-year-old model-actress and granddaughter of Ernest Hemingway was found dead in her Santa Monica, Calif., apartment on July 1, Authorities were still trying to deter-mine how she died.

The Margaux Hemingway Memorial Fund was announced by Paulette Maehara, chief executive officer of

the Epilepsy Foundation of America. Contributors can designate gifts to the Epilepsy Society of San Diego, or the foundation.

The money will be used to help fund national research and education programs on behalf of people with seizure disorders.

Douglas ordered to get drug treatment

NEWARK, N.J. (AP) — Eric Douglas was sentenced to 30 days in prison for letting his dog out its cage during a flight and ignoring repeated requests to put the animal back in.

And now it's microbrewed beers."

The art of beer-tasting as a trend has also spilled over into the art of home-brewing. Smith said home-brewing is an educated hobby an educated career for others.

He said the idea behind home-brewing is not intoxication. People brew their own beer because they want to learn more about different styles of beer. "There are a lot of students who brew and a whole lot of professors," he said. "There are two lo-

cal surgeons, an ex-mayor, city attorneys and other professionals that brew. Darryl Dincans, a senior agricultural engineering major, is one of the students who brews. In fact, Dincans won Brewfest 2 in the spring with his "Belgian Triple."

Dincans makes brewing sound easy. For the 1996 Brewer of the Year title, he leads in points based on contest rankings throughout the year, although he just started home-brewing in June of

"[Brewing] is easy," Dincans said. "To make good beer is incredibly simple. Trying to perfect it is when you start spending vast amounts of money." Dincans said learning to brew one's own beer can

Blackwelder said Prohibition and World War I shaped the history of American brewing. For is stance, light beer was created during the war for women, since most male beer-drinkers were overses.

"Every time I see a big-booted, huge-belt-buckled fellow with a longneck Bud Light," he said "I'm thinking, 'Son, you're drinking an effeminized version of a female's beer."

McGreger said the tour educates the public about the multicultural aspects of beer. But there is a whole world out there the public has vastly is

nored. Beer is just one of them.
"I don't like to limit myself to just beer," he said "People could open up to all sorts of things like dif-ferent beverages and ethnic foods as well. Beer is simply the tip of the iceberg.'
