

A&M researchers find aromatic urine

Texas A&M researchers may have discovered what turns on a randy stallion - horse urine.

Neuroscientists in the College of Veterinary Medicine have analyzed the ingredients of 45 aromatic chemicals in the urine of mares in season looking for a substance that can attract stallions from more than half a mile away.

Concentrations in seven chemicals rise sharply as mares approach the date of ovulation. Researchers believe that by unlocking the secrets of the chemicals, horse breeders can better time encounters between horses.

Professors win **Best Paper Award**

Three Texas A&M chemical engineering professors were honored by Fuel Science and Technology International with the 1996 Best Paper Award for Volume 13.

The paper, written by Professor Emeritus Richard R. Davison and professors Charles J. Glover and Jerry A. Bullin, discusses separating asphalt into smaller components by dissolving it in a solvent and applying intense heat.

The process allows scientists to create better asphalt.

AUSTIN (AP) — At least 39 people died on Texas streets and highways during the Labor Day holiday weekend, one less death than the number estimated by state troopers before the 78-hour period began.

The total could climb since any other victims who may die within 30 days of their injuries also will be listed for the Labor Day period.

The Texas Department of Public Safety's final report included three deaths in one car-train collision in Hale Center.

The DPS monitored traffic conditions from 6 p.m. Friday to midnight Monday, with all available troopers on the highways in an effort reduce the toll, Departme Public Safety officials said.




