Head Coach G. Guerrieri returns to alma mater as A&M soccer faces Tulsa in fourth straight road game

After coming out the victor in the Central Region games last weekend, the Texas A&M Soccer team is out to show the nation who truly deserves to be in the top spots and in the national championship finals December 6-8 in Santa Clara, Calif.

Though it was difficult to stay on the road for four days, the Aggies kicked and scored its way to a 3-0 record, dropping Vanderbilt University 4-1 Sept. 6, and then squeaking by the University of Alabama 2-1 in overtime play two days later.

These impressive performances earned the team a No. 8 ranking in the nation's best teams in the Soccer America Poll, and a No. 9 ranking in the USA Today Coaches Poll.

Despite their newfound national publicity, the Aggies are taking each game in stride while preparing for its Big 12 Conference opener against the University of Kansas on Friday.

But before the Jayhawks come calling, the team must beat the University of Tulsa today at 3 p.m. in Oklahoma.

While A&M Head Coach G. Guerrieri said he is slightly biased as a Tulsa alum, he challenged his team to keep improving and not to let Tulsa lightly.

"This is going to be a tough game against a very experienced team," Guerrieri said. "This is probably the biggest game on Tulsa's schedule, so they will be even more motivated to beat us. Not only are they highly

motivated, but they also have a good midfield."

Because Tulsa is unranked and fairly unknown on the national scene, senior forward Yvette Okler

said the team does not know what to expect.

"We really do not know any-

Scoring Machine

Blalack leads the team with five goals and one assist, and is on track to become the first-ever A&M player to ever lead the team in scoring for four straight seasons.

Getting Defensive

Freshman goalkeeper Melanie Wilson got the go-ahead to start just two games into her college career following a stellar performance against 17th-ranked Vanderbilt. Wilson allowed just one goal in 90 minutes of play against the Commodores. In addition, Wilson started in a teeth-clenching Alabama game and played for what seemed an endless 120 minutes allowing only one goal.

Currently, Wilson leads the Aggies in the goal tending area after playing 255 total minutes, racking up 10 saves and posting an impressive 0.71 goals-against average.

Joining Csizmadia on the A&M injury list is sophomore forward Nicole Shook, who also must sit out the season because of ligament tears in her right knee. In addition, sophomore defender Linda Castillejos is sidelined for two weeks with a knee injury suffered during an Aug. 16 squad scrimmage, freshman midfielder Heather Bertone is out with a strained thigh, and senior goalkeeper Sunny McConnell is recovering from an illness.

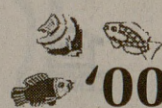
