"He went in for a test and they found had a very minor stroke," daughter. Goldwater said. "It's nothing serious, I'm not worried."

The 87-year-old leader of the 1960s servative movement was admitted Mond St. Joseph's Hospital

The hospital said Goldwater's re depends on a full evaluation of his test res Goldwater served in the Senate from to 1964, when he gave up the seat to be GOP's candidate for president.

He lost to President Lyndon Johnson landslide that year, but regained a Senat in 1968 and held it until he retired in 1986

Goldwater has had both of his hip joints replaced by prosthetic devices. He underwent triple-bypass heart surgery November 1982 and prostate surgery in the following year.

Ten years ago: On Wall Street, the Dow Jones




