Troops, families prepare for deployment

that apparently delayed their departure had little effect on thousands of 1st Cavalry Division troops Sunday as they prepared to deploy to the Middle East.

Kuwait on Sunday temporarily withheld permission for additional troops to take part in ongoing military exercises sparked by renewed threats from Iraqi leader Saddam Hussein toward Kuwait.

Military officials said they expected permission to deploy would come from Kuwaiti leaders, but the delay did not keep at least 3,000 troops from finishing up final arrangements.

They are all eager to do what they have come to the 1st Cavalry to do," said Col. Eric Olson, who commands the division's 3rd Battalion.

The battalion was alerted to prepare for deployment on Friday.
