Ministers offer counseling on campus

Professional religious workers representing several denominations will be at the All Faiths Chapel this week to offer counseling services to students needing advice. The counseling sessions are offered by the Texas A&M Campus Ministry Association. Sessions will be from 1 p.m. to 4 p.m., Monday through Thursday. The Rev. Dr. Frank Yates, CMA president, said students can go to the chapel to discuss various topics. "We won't pretend to be psychiatrists," Yates said. "It's an open house with campus ministers who will be able to discuss anything from theological issues to personal problems."

"If we can't help the student, or if the student's situation is more serious, we can refer them to Student Counseling Services."

Students are encouraged, Yates said, to stop by and talk to the religious leaders even though they may not be of the same faith.

The Rev. David Rowland, minister of The First Baptist Church, said students should feel comfortable approaching the religious leaders.

"Basically, we will provide students with someone to talk to," Rowland said. "We will refer students to their own minister or their own church if we need to. We're not going to try to pull them into our church."

A sign-up sheet will be available at the Chapel for students who would like to see when a

representative from their ministry will be available. The Rev. Mark Crawford, a

minister for the Episcopal Student Center, said students

should feel comfortable meeting with the religious leaders.

"It's going to be much like a study office hours," Crawford said. "Students are free to come in and out. If somebody wants to talk by and talk in private, we'll be at the door."

Rabbi Peter Tarlow of the Hillel Foundation, said members have worked together to organize the sessions. "In case someone wants to discuss religion with their own rabbi, we can facilitate that for them in touch with the rabbi they want to see," Tarlow said. "It's really been good how all various clergy members have worked together."

Troops, families prepare for deployment

FORT HOOD (AP) — Political maneuvering that apparently delayed their departure had little effect on thousands of 1st Cavalry Division troops Sunday as they prepared to deploy to the Middle East.

Kuwait on Sunday temporarily withheld permission for additional troops to take part in ongoing military exercises sparked by renewed threats from Iraqi leader Saddam Hussein toward Kuwait.

Military officials said they expected permission to deploy would come from Kuwaiti leaders, but the delay did not keep at least 3,000 troops from finishing up final arrangements.

"They are all eager to do what they have come to the 1st Cavalry to do," said Col. Eric Olson, who commands the division's 3rd Battalion.

The battalion was alerted to prepare for deployment on Friday.

"Through training and showing that we can deploy — and that once deployed we can conduct operations in preparation of a combat nature — there will be a deterrent effect" on the Iraqis, Olson told reporters. "There's always a measure of confusion at first."

Most of the troops spent Sunday double-checking supplies, preparing equipment and spending time with their families.

"We're just waiting around to get the word," said Sgt. Peter Nienever, a gunner on the crew

of a Bradley fighting vehicle. "I'm anxious to go. I have a problem with telling my wife goodbye three or four times."

Capt. Scott Jackson, of the 1st Battalion, said preparing family members is important to soldiers. He said having things at home in order helps them to concentrate on their training work in the field.

"The thing you always have to consider is the wives and kids are taken care of," he said.

Two wives, Lisa Castro and Erin Aiello, said their husbands have been deployed but it's never easy, especially with children they said.

"When we were told to prepare Friday, it was OK until I started thinking about the boys," Castro said of her 4-year-old and near-2-year-old. "They are going to miss their father."

Aiello said not having children makes the experience a little different. But she said the families left behind rally together and get extra support to those families who are going through their first overseas deployment.

"We spend a lot more time calling them and organizing things to keep them busy," she said. Castro and Aiello were part of a huge gathering of families and soldiers who were briefed Sunday on the possible deployment.

Olson told a packed auditorium on the base that the mission would be to train and build force in the region.

"It is wise for us to be prepared," he said, urging family members to stay close to each other and to remain confident in their soldiers.
