ATLANTA (AP) — John Smoltz became the majors' first 22-game winner, and Ryan Klesko hit a three-run double as Atlanta beat Houston 5-4 Tuesday night.

It was the third straight victory for the Braves after losing six in a row. Atlanta lowered its

magic number to seven for clinching its fifth straight postsea-son berth.

The Astros, who fell to 0-8 on the road this

month, lost their fourth in a row and seventh in nine games. They began the night 2 1/2 games behind first-place St. Louis in the NL Central.
