Nirvana releases new live album

NEW YORK (AP) — More than two years after the death of lead singer Kurt Cobain, Nirvana is releasing a new 16-song live album.

“From the ‘Banks of the Muddy Wishkah,’ painstakingly assembled from recordings of old concerts, is scheduled to be released Oct. 1.

It will be Nirvana's second release since Cobain's death. The first was “MTV Unplugged in New York,” which featured mellow, acoustic versions of the band's usually ear-shattering grunge hits.

Tribute to Twitty draws big names

NASHVILLE, Tenn. (AP) — Joe Diffie was a songwriter before he started recording successful albums himself, and having the late Conway Twitty sing one of his tunes was among the biggest thrills of his life.

“He gave a whole different dimension to the song with his unique style and made it his own,” Diffie said. “He was definitely the songwriter's best friend.”

Diffie joined Vince Gill, Travis Tritt, Tracy Lawrence and others at the Grand Ole Opry House Thursday night in a concert tribute to Twitty.

The concert, called “Hello Darlin’ — A Tribute to Conway Twitty,” is scheduled to air Feb. 10 on The Nashville Network.

Fitness magazine compares speeds

NEW YORK (AP) — Who would win a super-model mile, Cindy Crawford or Kim Alexis?

What if Al and Tipper Gore lined up against Oprah Winfrey?

According to the October issue of Fitness magazine, Kim would blow away Cindy, while the vice president and second lady would edge the first lady of television talk, although she may have more stamina.

The magazine compared 5-kilometer (3.1-mile) race times run by Alexis, Crawford and the Gores, along with a marathon run by Winfrey.

Alexis easily outdistanced the field, averaging 6.8-minute miles in the Beach Fest Run at Jacksonville, Fla. The Gores ran 10-minute miles in the Race for the Cure in Washington, while Crawford averaged 10.3-minute miles at the Revlon Run/Walk for Women in Los Angeles, Fitness said.

Winfrey averaged 10.3 minutes per mile at the 26.2-mile Marine Corps Marathon in Washington. Marathons, of course, typically produce slower per-mile times than shorter races.

Kennedy weds on Georgian island

CUMBERLAND ISLAND, Ga. (AP) — John John is the nation's No. 1 bachelor no more. John F. Kennedy Jr. tied the knot in a top secret weekend ceremony hidden from the prying eyes of the media.

Years of gossip about the man once dubbed “The Sexiest Man Alive” ended with a private wedding Saturday on this secluded island along the Georgia coast, close to the Florida state line.

“My cousin John did tie the knot yesterday,” Rep. Patrick Kennedy, D-R.I., confirmed Sunday morning at a fund-raiser for congressional candidate Robert Burch in Steubenville, Ohio. He gave no details, including the name of the bride.

Kennedy has been romantically linked for about five years to Carolyn Bessette, who works in public relations for Calvin Klein Ltd. in New York City.

But she was hardly the only woman linked to the dashing play-

boy who has it all — good looks, money and a link to Camelot.

The 35-year-old son of President John F. Kennedy, co-founder and editor of George magazine, ended a lengthy relationship with actress Darryl Hannah not long after his mother's funeral in May 1994.

And according to the New York Post, Kennedy finally popped the question to Bessette last year after she blew her top over a National Enquirer report that he had an affair with actress Sharon Stone.

In February, the couple was videotaped having a lovers' quarrel in a New York park, with talking, fighting, pouting and crying before they eventually made up. The 20-

However, Houchard said Aggies should see projects underway this semester.
