**Carrey ties the knot with Holly**

LOS ANGELES (AP) — The comedy actor has tied the knot.

Rubber-faced actor Jim Carrey married Picket Fences actress Lauren Holly on Monday, said Marleah Leslie, the actor's publicist.

Carrey, 34, and Holly, 32, met on the set of the 1994 comedy *Dumb and Dumber*. Both have been married once before. Carrey has also starred in two Ventura movies, *The Mask*

and *The Cable Guy*. Holly played a sheriff's deputy on *Picket Fences*.

**King releases two new horrors**

ARLINGTON, Va. (AP) — It's a double dose of Stephen King.

The best-selling horror author has not one but two new books in stores this week. Placed side-by-side, the covers of the books *Desperation* and *The Regulators* combine to make a mural with a snarling coyote, a burning house and the head of a vulture.

The characters have the same names and many meet bloody ends, though the plots are different.

*The Regulators* is the first time King has used his Richard Bachman pseudonym since 1985.

"In my own mind, I'm sort of a nice guy, and to me, Richard Bachman was always a miserable SOB," King said in Tuesday's USA Today. "That was liberating: Stephen King without a conscience."

**Eastwood settles legal fight with ex**

BURBANK, Calif. (AP) — Clint Eastwood and ex-lover Sondra Locke settled their bitter fight Tuesday over a film deal she had with Warner Bros.

The terms were not disclosed. The settlement came while a jury was deliberating.

Locke, 49, had filed a \$2-million fraud and contractual-interference suit against Eastwood, claiming he set up a three-film deal to trick the actress-director into dropping her 1989 palimony suit against him.

Locke never got to direct a film under the deal. She said she proposed 30 projects, and all were rejected.

Eastwood's lawyer, Ray Fisher, said the actor had nothing to do with the studio's decisions. Eastwood testified that he agreed to pay the studio \$1.25 million for the deal.

Eastwood and Locke met in 1975 while making *The Outlaw Josey Wales*. They began living together in 1976, while Eastwood was still married.

Morales said that although the band's music style of Saturday Night Moses is far from John Volta's 1970s disco movie, *Saturday Night Fever*, the two are linked by way of name.

"We were playing around with band names and somebody

said 'Disco Jesus,'" Morales said. "That made me think of Saturday Night Fever."

"I decided on Moses because Jesus already gets so much coverage in band names, and Moses was a good guy."

The band members are often found joking with one another, but Parish-Philp said there is a serious side to Saturday Night Moses, portrayed through "The April Song."

"I had a roommate for two years in this house — we called it the hot house — with no air-conditioning," he said.

"There was this poem by T.S.

Eliot that begins, 'April is the cruellest month,' so we always said, 'If we could just survive April,'" Parish-Philp said. It was kind of ironic that I found out at the beginning of April that my roommate had committed suicide. We play the song as a tribute to him."

Besides playing meaningful music, Philp said the band members want to expand B-CS into a more musical community.

"This school has so many students — there have to be more musicians out there," Philp said. "We want to see less competition between the bands and

bring everyone together and start drumming."
