Another Cinderella

The Anna Meagan illustrator steps into a personal fairytale by fulfilling her dreams as an artist.

ammie Bissett always knew her heart belonged in Aggieland. Bissett has been a professional artist for 15 years, and for the past twoand-a-half years, she has been creating Aggie artwork for Texas A&M.

"My parents saw a talent — that I had the ability to draw," Bissett said. "I started taking lessons when I was eight. My dad is Class of '71 and was here at A&M. It's neat that it all started here. Now I feel like I'm reliving my parents' life.

Bissett's studio, Bissett Designs, is in the upstairs area of her home, which is also her husband's study area. The Bissett home is adorned with paintings that share one underlying theme -Texas A&M.

"I don't make prints of everything I do, but I take photos for my portfolio," Bissett said. "Because the studio is in my home, people come in and see the ones that are most important to me on my walls."

Bissett was commissioned by the A&M College of Veterinary Medicine to paint a poster of the Southwest Conference mascots.

She also drew the Rockwell-esque "Anticipation," a painting of a cadet in front of a full-length mirror that appeared in the December issue of The Texas Aggie magazine, and "Saturday Night Aggies," an illustration presented to A&M Head Football Coach R.C. Slocum last Saturday after the Colorado game.

Center and creates western art. The artist recently took on a new project when she illustrated the Aggie Cinderella book, Anna Meagan,

by Cindy Boettcher. She said she plans to work with Boettcher on her second book Whoop, Whoop.

Bissett said illustrating the children's book was something she had dreamed of long before Boettcher called her.

"I'd always thought about doing a book because my husband is a wonderful writer, and I had talked to him about putting together a children's book," she said.

She said finding inspiration to paint is not a problem once she gets "on a roll."

"It usually takes anypiece," she said.

"Sometimes it's just magic, then I work nonstop around the clock. I like my paintings to have feeling and tell a story. I've accomplished what I want to do if I can make someone smile.'

Bissett takes her artwork seriously. She researches and sets up photo shoots before she begins a painting.

"It's one thing to be able to draw, and another to use your imagination to create," Bissett said. "It takes time.


She also said she wants to help oth-

ers develop their artistic skills. "A gracious person is not afraid or insecure to discuss their talent and encouragement


