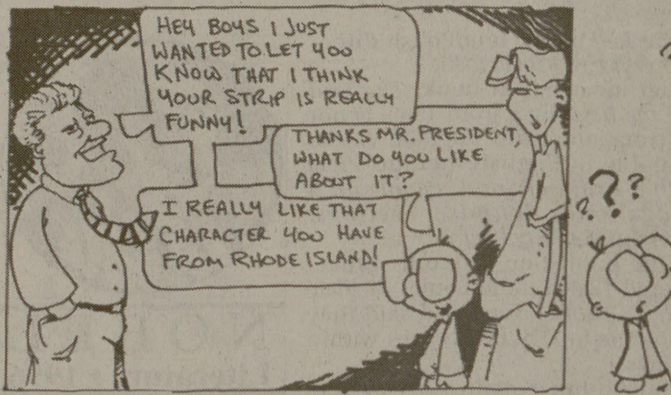

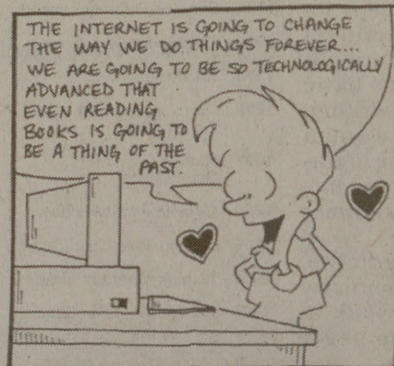

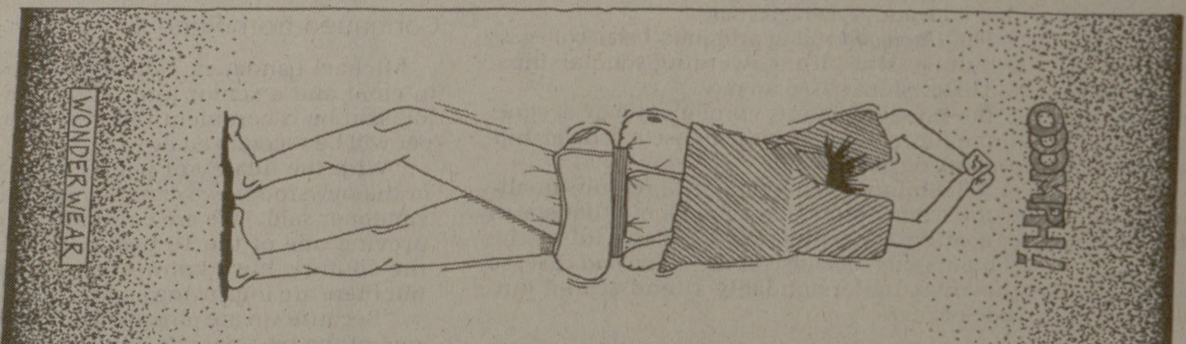

**Local beer denied at San Antonio celebration**

SAN ANTONIO (AP)—A local beer brewed from a St. Louis-based brewery rather than a local one is being denied during next year's Old San Antonio celebration.

It will be the first time the event's 49-year history that beer brewed along the banks of the San Antonio River will not be tap for the event sponsored by the San Antonio Conservation Society and held during the city's Fiesta celebration.

This year, thirsty revelers will not be gulping Lone Star or Budweiser, Bud Light and Schlitz — beers offered by Budweiser, the local distributor for Budweiser, Busch Cos. — will be available. Lutz Issleib, president of Lone Star Brewing Co., which employs 1,000 workers at its downtown brewery, told reporters the company should change the name of its annual fund-raiser to "A New Old St. Louis."

Issleib says Pearl Brewing Co. "made a dime" from the event many years.

"Pearl Brewing Co. has been part of our city for 110 years," he said. "Doesn't that merit recognition? You'd think that the shutdown of Lone Star would give some consideration."

It was strictly a business decision, said Sally Buchanan, president of the conservation society. "The thrust of our event is a beer festival," she said of the event that raised 78 percent of the city's revenue last year. "Not in 1990s, with some years having more than a family-oriented event."
