Alomar's suspension not enough, ump's say

NEW YORK (AP) — Roberto Alomar will serve his five-game suspension for spitting on an umpire next season. That much is clear.

Whether umpires will walk out Friday is uncertain.

And once again, baseball finds itself in the middle of a big mess.

The Baltimore Orioles' All-Star second baseman withdrew the appeal of his suspension Wednesday night, canceling a hearing before American League president Gene Budig that had been scheduled for today.

Now umpires must decide if they'll violate the no-strike clause in their labor agreement and walk out Friday in protest of what they believe is a too lenient penalty.

"(Budig) has elected to cancel tomorrow's hearing and grant Alomar a five-day spring vacation, with pay, for spitting in the face of an umpire," umpires union head Richie Phillips said.

Once Alomar dropped his appeal, the suspension became automatic. Both the owners and the umpires said they expect to be back in federal court Friday in Philadelphia, where the American and National leagues had asked for an injunction that would prevent umpires from walking out.

Union head Donald Fehr, speaking during an annual news conference at Yankee Stadium during the New York-Yankees playoff game, demanded Phillips, who wants Alomar suspended immediately.

"The last thing this sport needs is more confrontation like the Fehr said.

Alomar, speaking earlier today, said he wasn't having any problems coping with the controversy.

"I'm going to sleep the way I sleep my whole life," he said. "I have nothing to worry about."

Some umpires expect U.S. District Judge Edmund Luddick to sue an injunction if they don't settle. The labor agreement says umpires signed in May 1995 gains a no-strike clause.

"We signed a contract to do that and we're obligated to do that," umpire Drew Coble said Wednesday before the Indians-Orioles game.

Coble sounded as if he would prefer that umpires take a more approach to negotiations with baseball's lawyers.

"I don't like the situation to arise," he said. "Something has to be done before it gets out of hand. I'm not sure some of the things we've taken are justified."

Alomar apologized to umpire John Hirschbeck for spitting incident and offered to make a \$50,000 charitable contribution. Baltimore owner Steve Angelos offered to contribute \$50,000, too.

Pagnozzi, Cardinals graduate series lead over San Diego

ST. LOUIS (AP) — A member of the St. Louis Cardinals' mostly forgotten old guard ended nine years of frustration.

Tom Pagnozzi, who played on the 1987 World Series team before the Cardinals had several mediocre seasons, drove in the game-winner with a shot off reliever Trevor Hoffman in the eighth inning Thursday, giving St. Louis a 5-4 win over the San Diego Padres and a 2-0 lead in their NL playoff series.

The teams resume the best-of-5 series Saturday in San Diego.

St. Louis had blown a 4-1 lead, allowing San Diego to tie it in the eighth on Steve Finley's RBI groundout.

Brian Jordan drew a leadoff walk in the ninth off Doug Bochler and advanced on a groundout before John Mabry, who hadn't hit the ball out of the infield in six playoff at-bats, was intentionally walked.

Bochler's wild pitch moved the runners into scoring position, and Pagnozzi hit a 1-1 pitch just to the left of Hoffman, who got the tip of his glove on the ball but couldn't catch it. The ball bounced to second baseman Jody Reed, who threw to first as Jordan scored.

"It was big," Pagnozzi said. "I knew that I had to put the ball in play. ... It was huge."

Dennis Eckersley pitched a perfect ninth for his second year of the series and the 13th of his postseason career.

Ron Gant had a three-run home run in the fifth, giving St. Louis a 4-1 lead. Manager matters as v Caminiti homered to increase, A for San Diego. The Cardinals loaded the bases in the fifth on singles by Steve Sanders, Gant 2-2 pitch Dario Veras center fielder

Finley's head. Benes retired the first two, striking out six. Caminiti led off the fifth with his homer.

Benes struck out nine allowed four runs on six hits in the eighth, leaving Pagnozzi allowing a leadoff single to pitcher Scott Livingstone walk to Rickey Henderson batting champion Tony Gwynn facing Rick Honeycutt, sacing the runners and Finley's ground to first tied it.

Sanders, who lasted 4 1/3 innings, allowed four runs on three hits.
