- TWO MILES:** Start at G. Rollie White

Retrace Route
- TWO AND ONE-HALF MILES:** Follow Two Mile Run

Cycling has increased in popularity at A&M. Gordon estimated his shop sells 450 bikes a year to people who wanted to ride them to campus.

Davis said the cycling team has over 60 paid members with 30 members who train daily and participate in various races.

Gordon said cyclists need to improve their safety practices. He said 50 percent of cyclists do not obey traffic laws. Increased safety awareness would lower the number of collisions involving bicycles. Gordon said the cost of the vast majority of accidents, involving bicycle repairs, comes from the cyclists pocket.
