

Cyclist Armstrong wo stricken with cancer

PARIS (AP) — Lance Armstrong, America's top cyclist and a former world champion, announced Tuesday he is suffering from cancer and is having chemotheraphy treatment to try to control the spread of the disease.

Armstrong, 25, said he had a malignant tumor on a testicle and had it removed on Oct. 3, a day after it was discovered. He made the comments in a teleconference call from Austin, Texas to announce his withdrawal from the world championships which start this week in Lugano, Switzerland.

Armstrong won the world championship in 1993 and took sixth in the time trial and 12th in the road race at the Atlantic Olympics. Armstrong, who last month

joined the French cycling team Cofidis, said he had no plans to quit the sport but admitted he was stunned by the news. "A month ago — a month ago — I was competing in Europe at the

highest level," Armstrong said.

SAN ANTONIO (AP) — Fresh from his first pro victory at the Las Vegas Invitational, Tiger Woods leaves no doubt about how he intends to finish in this week's Texas Open.

"Hopefully first," the confident 20-year-old said Tuesday. Every tournament I go to I try to win it flat out. That's it," Woods said. "You don't ever want to be a

loser. You want to be a winner." Winner was his title Sunday when Woods beat Davis Love III in a playoff to claim victory in Las Vegas and qualify for the PGA Tour. It was only Woods' fifth tournament since turning pro in August.

Each time out, the three-time U.S. Amateur champion has improved his performance. He finhe said. ished 60th at the Greater Milwaukee Open, 11th at the Canadian Open, fifth at the Quad City Classic and third at the B.C. Open before posting his victory Sunday.
