State officials aim to prevent abuse

EL PASO, Texas (AP) - State child protection authorities are hoping that policy changes prompted by the death of a 3month-old girl will help identify possible cases of abuse before they escalate.

'We can't change the past,' said Eddie Wilson, regional director for Child Protective Services. "But we need to learn from situations like this one and figure out ways to do our job better.'

Cassandra Garcia died in July after being shaken. Her father, Miguel Angel Garcia, was charged with murder. Two months earlier she had been taken to a hospital with a suspicious head injury her parents couldn't explain, but was returned to her home.


As a result, CPS officials are inaugurating new procedures aimed at preventing future fatalities.

(AP) — Today is Thursday, Oct. 10, the 284th day of 1996. There are 82 days left in the year.

On this date:

In 1845, the U.S. Naval Academy opened at Annapolis, Md.

In 1886, the tuxedo dinner jacket made its American debut at the autumn ball in Tuxedo Park, N.Y.

In 1913, the waters of the Atlantic and Pacific oceans commingled in the Panama Canal after U.S. engineers blew up the Gamboa Dam.

In 1938, Germany completed its annexation of Czechoslovakia's Sudetenland.

In 1970, Quebec Labor Minister Pierre Laporte was kidnapped by the Quebec Liberation Front, a militant separatist group. (Laporte's body was found about a week later.)

In 1973, Vice President Spiro T. Agnew, accused of accepting bribes, pleaded no contest to one count of federal income tax evasion, and resigned his office. In 1985, actor Yul Brynner died in New York at age 65; actor-director Orson Welles died in Los Angeles at age 70.

Ten years ago: An earthquake measuring 7.5 on the Richter scale struck San Salvador, El Salvador, killing an estimated 1,500 people.

Five years ago: The Senate Judiciary Committee prepared to reopen the confirmation hearing of Supreme Court nominee Clarence Thomas, accused of sexual harassment by a former aide, Anita Hill.
