Guardsmen are obligated to eight years of service, with six years of active drilling and two years of inactive duty.

Members are required to complete Army basic training, report for duty one weekend a month and two weeks during the summer.

Chris Winnek, a scholarship recipient and a sophomore environmental design major, said the offer, which also applies to summer sessions, is ideal.

"Financially, I just couldn't resist," Winnek said. "It just gives you an opportunity to serve your country and get financial aid with it."

The service requirement has not been in the way of his other plans, Winnek said.

"It's an exciting vacation once a month," he said. "It's almost like being in the army."

Danny Feather, a scholarship applicant and a junior agriculture economics major, said the scholarship offers more flexibility than six years of military service.

Feather said the Guard is a better option than enlisting in the military for students pursuing graduate studies or beginning a career.

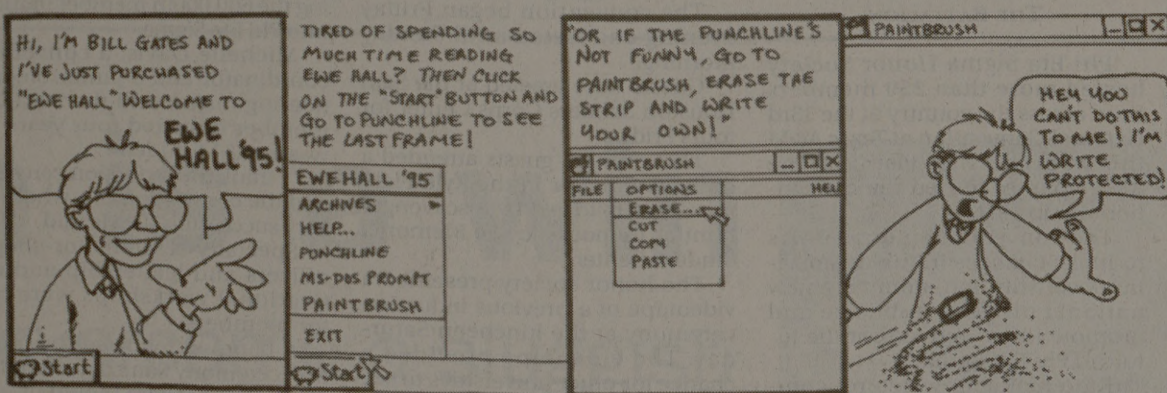
"I would like to serve my country," Feather said. "It's the best of both worlds."
