(AP) — Today is Tuesday, Oct. 15, the 289th day of 1996. There are 77 days left in the year. On this date:

In 1860, 11-year-old Grace Bedell of Westfield, N.Y., wrote a letter to presidential candidate Abraham Lincoln, suggesting he could improve his appearance by growing a beard.
In 1946, the St. Louis Cardinals won the World

Series by defeating the visiting Boston Red Sox, 4-3, in Game 7. In 1951, the situation comedy I Love Lucy pre-

miered on CBS.

In 1966, President Johnson signed a bill creating the Department of Transportation.

In 1969, peace demonstrators staged activities across the country, including a candlelight march around the White House, as part of a moratorium against the Vietnam War.

In 1976, 20 years ago, in the first debate of its kind between vice-presidential nominees, Democrat Walter F. Mondale and Republican Bob Dole faced off in Houston.

In 1990, Soviet President Mikhail S. Gorbachev was named the winner of the Nobel Peace Prize.

Five years ago: The Senate narrowly confirmed the nomination of Clarence Thomas to the Supreme Court, by a vote of 52-48.

Police search for UNT student's killer

DALLAS (AP) - Police were looking for several men involved in the fatal shooting of a University of North Texas student from South Korea.

Eun-ha Suh, 22, was shot twice early Sunday after she and her boyfriend fled from an altercation in a Dallas nightclub.

Police said she exited Interstate 35E in Farmers Branch and headed south when shots were fired about 2 a.m. from a car that pulled alongside on a service road.

Her boyfriend ducked down but was grazed by a bullet. He managed to stop the car and then drove her to Parkland Hospital Health System, where she was pronounced dead.

Suh was enrolled in the Intensive English Language Institute at UNT, a school official said.

Police believe the two or three suspects are regulars at The Ritz Rock, on Walnut Hill Lane in northwest Dallas. They were believed to be driving a red four-
