Allen Big 12 Player of Week

DALLAS (AP) — Colorado senior safety Steve Rosga's career-high 19 tackles against Oklahoma State has prompted the Big 12 Conference to recognize him as defensive player of the week.
Rosga of Roseville, Minn., had 14 unassisted tackles in the Buffaloes' 35-13 victory over Oklahoma State and was also credited with a touchdown-saving hit on a fourth-down play.
On the other side of the line,

Oklahoma halfback James Allen was offensive player of the week for his season-high 159-yard rushing performance on 23 carries and one touchdown against Texas Tech in the Sooners' 30-27 upset Saturday.
Allen, a senior from Newwood, Okla., made the winning TD on a 2-yard run in overtime of the Cotton Bowl.
He also paced the Sooners in receiving attack with five catches for 51 yards and best reception of 21 yards.

Qualifying for the NCAA Championships this year would be a special accomplishment for Pantano because it will be held in Minneapolis, Minn., the same place it was held his freshman year.
"They rotate every three years," Pantano said. "It would be like a historical cycle to return to Minneapolis in my last year."
Junior Kyle Marden, Pantano's teammate and closest friend, said other members of the team react to Pantano's work and success, and his leadership has helped the team build upon its successes.
"Everyone on the team is equal," Marden said. "But Robb has been here the longest, and he is an outgoing kind of guy. We need people like that."
"My freshman year, I set a goal to qualify for NCAA's and to see Robb as a sophomore qualify for a second year. I saw that it could be done."
Nash said it is a combination of Pantano's personality and accomplishments that make him the biggest draw for incoming recruits.

"With him being a captain the last two years, we got half the recruits we have now," Nash said. "They saw what he did for A&M, and ten of this year's recruits are here because of him."
Pantano set a goal for himself when he was younger — compete in the Olympic Games. But now that the Atlanta Games have come and gone, Pantano said he has no intention of trying for the Sydney Olympics in 2000.
"I'm not going to train for three more years," Pantano said. "This is it. One came when I was in my 'prime' and I'm not going to spend the time unless I'm guaranteed a spot, and in the sport nothing is guaranteed."
When he walks away from the team at the end of the season, Pantano said he will have nothing but fond memories of being the ringleader of a squad which is pointed in the right direction for the future.
"I will have so much fun in time, but I will really miss Pantano said. "The guys on the team are my best friends, and being away from the daily hangings on will be strange. Hopefully, I will look back and be proud. No other experience comes close to the atmosphere and the guys on the team."
