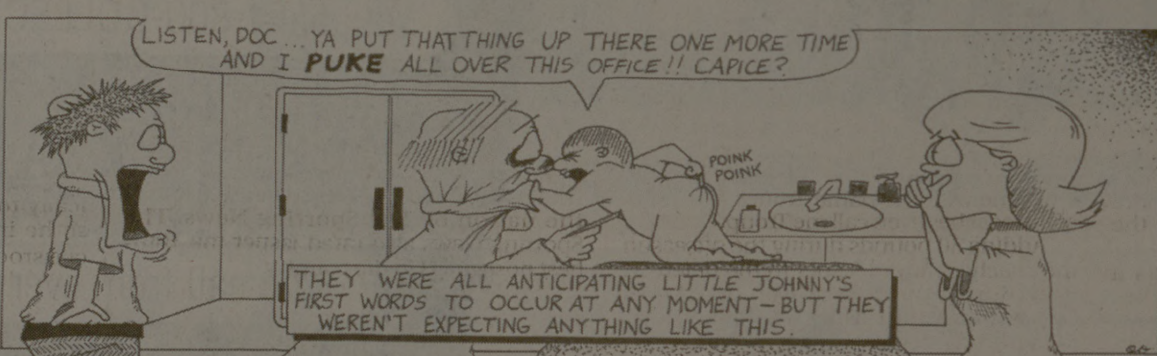
**Ross Perot**
