Clinton sends personal note to Nancy Reagan

DAYTONA BEACH, Fla. (AP) -President Clinton sent Nancy Reagan a personal note Wednesday after she objected to a campaign ad featuring Jim Brady, Ronald Reagan's wounded press secretary.

The White House did not release the note's message but said the ad would stop running in a day or so.

"If we continue to advertise on this issue, we'll take Mrs. Reagan's views into consideration," presidential spokesman Mike McCurry said.

The ad, unveiled last week, shows Brady — shot during the assassination attempt on President Reagan in 1981 — praising President Clinton for a gun control bill. It opens with footage of the attempt on Reagan's life.

"This horrible re-enactment stretches even the minimum levels of civility in current political advertising," Nancy Reagan wrote.

McCurry said the ad "really doesn't have anything to do with either President Reagan or Mrs. Reagan.

Besides, he said, "that particular footage, of course, Mrs. Reagan introduced at the Republican convention" in a GOP video. "So it's a very familiar scene to all Americans and certainly to Mrs. Reagan.

McCurry said Brady and his wife. Sarah, a leader of gun-control efforts, "are obviously sympathetic to Mrs. Reagan's concern."






