"We accomplish our mission through community service, advocacy, research and education (C.A.R.E.)," she said. The local March of Dimes office will receive 10 percent of the money raised, Spies said, and the rest will go to the national office.

However, since A&M has two research grants from the national office totaling \$108,000, more of the money raised will return to the Brazos Valley.

"Last year we raised \$98,000, and \$114,500 came back," Spies said. A portion of the money funds the Brazos Valley Maternal and Child Health Center to publish Spanish prenatal care literature. Spies said the efforts of the March of

Dimes benefit everyone, and a definite need for the work exists.

Babies born in 23 other countries have a better chance of living to their first birthday than children born in the United States, she said.

"People need to start thinking about healthy lifestyles now to have healthy babies later," Spies said. "Everybody wants to have healthy babies."
