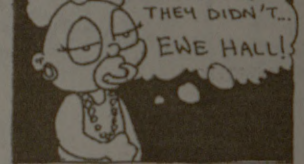

The year-long project included the construction of a landscaped pond stocked with fish and a large courtyard patio with a Spanish-style fountain.

The nearly \$1 million project was funded by former students. Dr. Chester Reed, Class of '47, donated the funds for the house. The pond was funded by C.E. Olsen, Class of '23, and August Bering, Class of '35, donated the courtyard and fountain.

Other benefactors include former students Les Appelt, Class of '41, Pat Zachry, Class of '22, Mike Halbouty, Class of '30, and Edward Mosher, Class of '28.

A 6-foot wire strand fence protects the contemporary-style home from cattle, horses and sheep that roam the area.

The home was built with large common areas to facilitate entertaining guests.

The guest quarters include a private kitchen

and can be closed off from the rest of the house for complete privacy.

Mrs. Thompson said there has only been one instance where she felt uncomfortable in the years she has lived in the house — an encounter with a reptile.

"I looked out the window and saw what I like a 5-foot water moccasin," Thompson said, "but I'm not sure if they killed it."

Some of the features of the home include a copper roof, wood windows and shutters, sun board walls and wood flooring.

Picnic tables strewn throughout the back on the shore of the pond create a welcoming atmosphere for outside entertainment.

Thompson said it makes the perfect setting for a barbecue.

"We had about 300 employees [of the State] out here for a barbecue in the spring," she said.
