Medhurst said adding a doctoral program will complete the building process of the communication program that was started in 1985.

The speech communications master's program was implemented in 1990.

The doctorate plan would probably consist of two to three years of course work, he said, followed by the writing of a dissertation.

"We would admit people to the degree plan contingent upon their fulfilling Texas A&M's curriculum requirements for the B.A. and M.A.

in speech communication," Medhurst said.

The proposal for the doctorate in speech communication has been approved by the Board of Regents and has been submitted to the Coordinating Board for final approval.

Douglas said the doctorate in speech communication and the bachelor of arts in music, if approved will be taught on the College Station campus. The B.A. degree in maritime studies would be offered at Texas A&M Galveston.

"I am pleased that the Coordinating Board has seen fit to add these degrees to our Table of Pro-

grams and look forward to working with the faculty, the Regent's Office and the Coordinating Board on the details that each ultimately become reality," Douglas said.

Powell said both programs must receive final approval from the Board before their implementation can be initiated.

The proposals for the maritime studies programs are currently being developed.

"These program proposals have not yet been submitted to the System Board of Regents for review and no timetable has been set regarding when that will happen," Douglas said.
