The OSU football team is not as strong now, Bowen said, because they have a young team and a new coach.

"Oklahoma State is in a building process," Bowen said. "I suspect we'll be favored."

The Aggies are favored to win the game by 13 points.

When Bowen left OSU, he did not immediately stop following its athletic teams. In his first year as president of A&M, Bowen and his wife traveled to watch the OSU basketball team play in the NCAA Final Four.

"The biggest athletic thrill was to see them in the Final Four," he said.

Bowen said the two universities are similar but have several differences, too.

"They were Oklahoma A&M," he said. "A lot of their former students still call themselves Aggies."

Many Texas A&M faculty members have degrees from OSU, he said, and the geographical proximity and similar academic programs draw OSU faculty to A&M, and vice versa.

The campuses have several differences, though, Bowen said. A&M is 17 years senior to OSU. The Oklahoma buildings have similar brick colors and building designs, he said.

"Unlike A&M, they have very consistent architecture," he said.

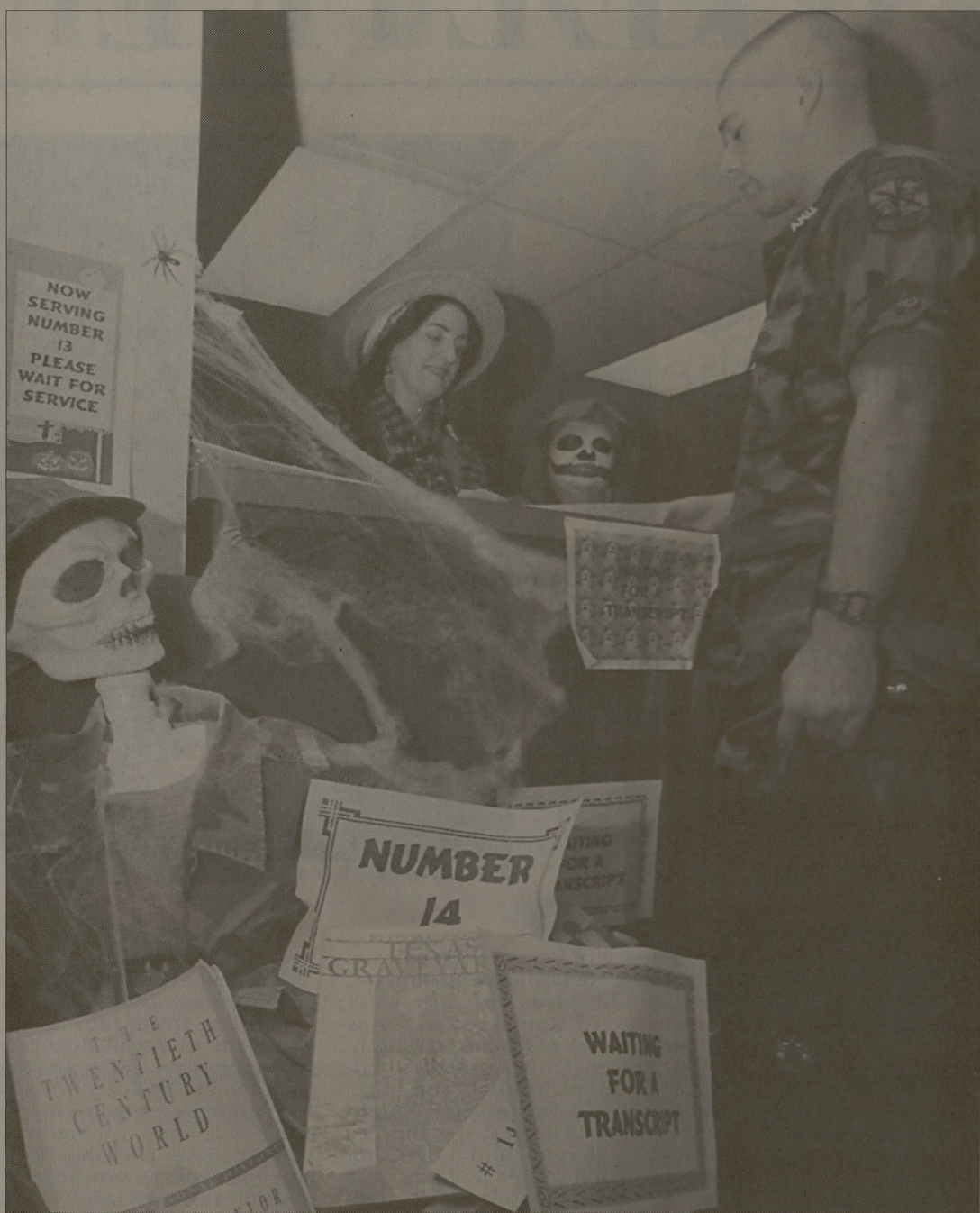
