In 1952, Dwight D. Eisenhower was elected president, defeating Democrat Adlai Stevenson.


In 1980, Ronald Reagan won the White House as he defeated President Carter by a strong margin



Tarrant County leads state in sex offenders

FORT WORTH, Texas (AP) - Despite a state promise to curtail the number of paroled sex offenders sent to Tarrant County, the area still leads Texas in the percentage of rapists and molesters imported from other counties

The county is home to 253 paroled sex offenders, slightly more than half of whom were shipped in from other counties across the state.

In August 1995, state offic promised to reduce that rate in sponse to local outrage over county getting a disproportion share of paroled sex offenders.




