NEW YORK (AP) - Almost Perfect apparently wasn't. The comedy was one of two put

on "hiatus" — meaning there's no immediate plans to reschedule them - by CBS after a disastrous opening night for its Wednesday lineup.

The network also temporarily shelved the lauded drama EZ Streets, and plans to show movies for the rest of the month in the now-vacant Wednesday night spots.

CBS had pledged patience for its new programming, but moved quickly because of the critical November ratings "sweeps" period,

which began Thursday.






