Blood drive seeks donors this week

BloodCare will be on campus this week with a goal of collecting 1700 units of blood.

The drive will be today through Nov. 21 from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. and Nov. 22 from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. Blood may be donated at Sbisa Dining Hall, the Memorial Student Center, the Commons, the Wehner Building or on the Quadrangle.

Anyone 17 or older, weighing a minimum of 110 pounds and in general good health is eligible to donate.

BloodCare is a regional non-profit blood center serving Dallas and six surrounding counties in north Texas. More than 600 people daily must pledge to donate blood to meet the demands of the more than 100 hospitals and health care facilities served by BloodCare.


