First Turkey Trot to benefit Austin poor

The first man and woman Longhorn and Aggie to cross the finish line of the Thunder Cloud Subs Turkey Trot, which will be held Thanksgiving day in Austin, will receive an award to commemorate the U.T. vs. Texas A&M football game.

Runners in the five-mile competition must wear a shirt clearly identifying them as a Longhorn or Aggie.

The competition begins at 9 a.m. at Zilker Park. Registration forms will be available at the race. There is a \$15 entry fee, which includes a long-sleeved Turkey Trot T-shirt.

All proceeds will benefit Caritas of Austin, an organization that provides emergency assistance to Austin's poor. Participants are also asked to bring personal items such as toothpaste, shampoo and paper towels to donate to Caritas.

(AP) — Today is Wednesday, Nov. 27, the 332nd day of 1996. There are 34 days left in the year.

In 1839, the American Statistical Association was founded in Boston.

In 1910, New York's Pennsylvania Station opened.

In 1942, during World War II, the French navy at Toulon scuttled its ships and submarines to keep them out of the hands of the Nazis.

In 1970, Pope Paul VI, visiting the Philippines, was slightly wounded at the Manila airport by a dagger-wielding Bolivian painter disguised as a priest.

In 1973, the U.S. Senate voted 92-to-3 to confirm Gerald R. Ford as vice president, succeeding Spiro T. Agnew, who had resigned.

In 1978, San Francisco Mayor George Moscone and City Supervisor Harvey Milk, a gay-rights activist, were shot to death inside City Hall by former supervi-

sor Dan White.

In 1983, 183 people were killed when a Colombian Avianca Airlines Boeing 747 crashed near Madrid's Barajas airport.

In 1985, the British House of Commons approved the Anglo-Irish accord giving Dublin a consultative role in the governing of British-ruled Northern Ireland.

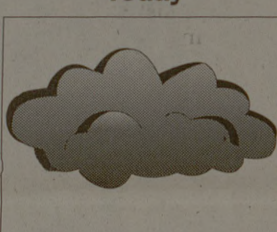
In 1989, 107 people were killed when a bomb blamed on drug traffickers destroyed a Colombian jetliner.

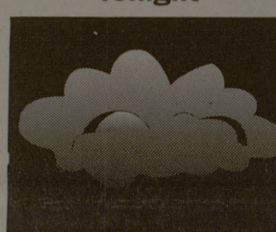

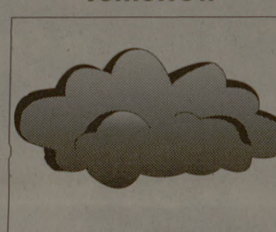

DEADLINE: December 6, 1996
Undergraduate Student Requirements:
1. You must be a degree seeking student and have a total of 95 credit hours reflected on the Texas A&M University Student Information Management System. (A passed course, which is repeated and passed, cannot count as additional credit hours.)
2. 30 credit hours must have been completed in residence at Texas A&M University, providing that prior to January 1, 1994, you were registered at Texas A&M University and successfully completed a fall/spring semester or summer term (I and II or 10 weeks) as a full-time student in good standing (as defined in the University catalog).
3. 60 credit hours must have been completed in residence at Texas A&M University if your first semester at Texas A&M University was January 1994 or thereafter, or if you do not qualify under the successful semester requirement. Should your degree be conferred with less than 60 resident credits, this requirement will be waived after your degree is posted on the Student Information Management System.
4. You must have a 2.0 cumulative GPR at Texas A&M University.
5. You must be in good standing with the University, including no registration or transcript blocks for past due fees, loans, parking tickets, returned checks, etc.
Graduate Student Requirements
If you are a December 1996 degree candidate and you do not have an Aggie ring from a prior degree, you may place an order after you meet the following requirements:
1. Your degree is conferred and posted on the Texas A&M University Student Information Management System; and
2. You are in good standing with the University, including no registration or transcript blocks for past due fees, loans, parking tickets, returned checks, etc.
If you have completed all of your degree requirements and can obtain a "Letter of Completion" from the Office of Graduate Studies, the original letter of completion, with the seal, may be presented to the Ring Office in lieu of your degree being posted.
Procedure To Order A Ring:
1. If you meet all of the above requirements, you must visit the Ring Office no later than Friday, December 6, 1996, to complete the application for eligibility verification.
2. If your application is approved and you wish to receive your ring on February 19, 1997, you must return and pay in full by cash, check, money order, or your personal Visa or Mastercard (with your name imprinted) no later than December 11, 1996.
