fake beard, dark glasses, a baseball cap and wig — the Polo Shirt Bandit has successfully robbed 37 banks without hurting anyone.

Guess was a 1969 graduate of Temple High School and was the school's captain of the basketball and golf teams that year. He became a Temple-area car dealer who lived in the nearby community of Oenaville with his wife, his former high school sweetheart,

His only previous criminal history were two convictions for drunken driving.

Stephen Sharum, who used his truck to stop Guess' rental car during the chase, said Saturday he's been told he may receive half of the \$25,000 reward offered for the bandit's capture. He said he was contacted by the Clearing House Association of the Southwest, an association of Texas banks.

"I'm not going to bank on anything except what's in my checking account," Sharum said. "I didn't do it for the money. I'd like to have the money, but I don't want anything that's not coming to me.'

Sharum said he could use the money, especially since his truck is now banged up.

But he said he would do it again even if there was no reward. 'I didn't know who it was they were chasing," Sharum said. "I just thought he was a guy that drove like an idiot. All I did was stop my truck in front of him. The officers out there put their lives on the line to surround him in the car.'


