Astronauts must return a day early

CAPE CANAVERAL, Fla. (AP) -With bad weather in the forecast, a jammed hatch and trouble with the navigation equipment, NASA on Wednesday ordered space shuttle Columbia's astronauts to come home a day early.

Columbia was due to land at Cape Canaveral just after daybreak Thursday

Earlier in the week, NASA had granted the five astronauts an extra, 17th day in space. But the space agency took it back after the astronauts accomplished their final job in orbit Wednesday - retrieving the ultraviolet telescope they dropped off at the start of the
