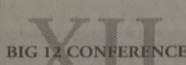

"Now they've told the students that they don't want what 65 percent of the students want," Howard said.

Rob Cullison, a Northside senator, Rules and Regulations committee member and sophomore political science major, voted in the Nov. 24 meeting to send the bill to the Senate, but voted against discharging the bill from committee Wednesday night.

Cullison said he believed the Senate should have debated the issue, but voted against discharging the bill because he respects the 17 other committee members and the votes they made.

Cullison said a motion to discharge a bill is usually used when a committee does not do its job, and he believes the committee did its job.

"That motion to discharge the bill was in effect telling those senators (in the committee) ... they didn't do their job," Cullison said.

Chris Torn, head yell leader and a senior agricultural development major, said he does not support run-off elections and thinks the Senate made the right decision in not discharging the bill.

Torn said the present election system works, and rewards those candidates who campaign hard.

"I believe right now we have a system that rewards people for campaigning their rears off," Torn said. "It allows anyone who's willing to work hard to win."

Gary Kipe, a senior yell leader and an agricultural development major, said he is in support of what A&M students want.

"I feel that as representatives of the student body that they (senators) were elected to represent the views of the student body," Kipe said.

"The student body clearly said what they wanted. I believe the student senators have taken that information and moved forward with it instead of sitting on it."

In other business, the Senate approved the Flexible Tuition and Fee Simplification Resolution, and the Policy on Minors was passed unanimously.

The Flexible Tuition and Fee Simplification Resolution stated that the Student Body is not in favor of Representative Ogden's Fee Simplification Bill or Senator Ratliff's Flexible Tuition Bill.

The Policy on Minors Bill outlined a university-wide minors policy, since the University does not currently have an official policy regarding academic minors.

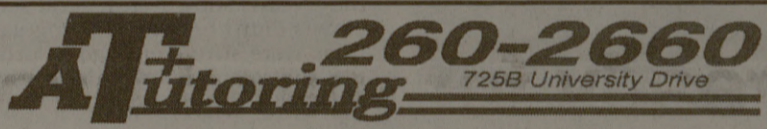
