## Barkley plays nice as Rockets send Knicks packing, 106-86

HOUSTON (AP) — Charles Barkley had 29 points, 12 rebounds and no fights with Charles Oakley as the Houston Rockets beat the New York Knicks for the first time since Game 7 of the 1994 NBA Finals, 106-86 Tuesday night.

The Rockets snapped a four-game losing streak to the Knicks and broke New York's four-game winning streak.

All eyes were on Barkley and Oakley early in the game. Oakley body-slammed Barkley to the floor during an exhibition game in October and received a two-game suspension and \$10,000 fine. Barkley drew a one-game suspension and \$5,000 fine.

Barkley talked more trash than usual and dominated the matchup in the first half, scoring 24 points

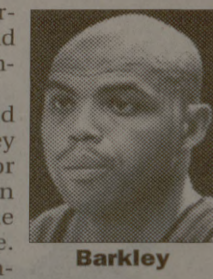
as the Rockets quickly established command and opened a 63-43 halftime lead.

"I wanted to kill Oakley for what he did in the previous game," Barkley said in a post-game interview on TNT. Asked what caused Oakley to have such animosity for him, Barkley replied: "It's that steroid thing. He goes crazy at times."

The Knicks made a mild charge at the beginning of the third quarter, scoring the first seven points to cut Houston's lead to 63-50. Allan Houston hit the first three baskets and John Starks followed with a 3-pointer before Hakeem Olajuwon scored seven points over a five-minute span to keep the Knicks down.

Barkley hit his first nine free throws and the Rockets finished 21-of-24 at the line. The Rockets also shot 9-of-23 on 3-point baskets, including 3-of-5 by Clyde Drexler.

Chris Childs led the Knicks with 19 points. Houston and Patrick Ewing each added 13 points.

## Tigers push Bears back in cave

COLUMBIA, Mo. (AP) — After a prolonged absence, the home court advantage was back at Missouri.

"I had a pretty good time tonight, really," Jason Sutherland said after scoring 19 points to help the Tigers end a school-record four-game home conference losing streak with an 82-66 victory over Baylor on Tuesday night.

"I think everyone was out there having fun. We were just relaxing."

Kelly Thames led an early-second half run that put the game

away and Tyron Lee added 18 points for Missouri (9-7, 1-3 Big 12), which also had begun the conference schedule with three losses overall for the first time since 1985.

In the first three Big 12 games, Missouri never led by more than six points. In fact, the Tigers hadn't led by more than 10 points since beating Southern 111-69 on Dec. 30.

"You know, when you lose a couple, three games it's hard to

"Calvin is a leader in the way he plays, but he's not a vocal guy," Barone said. "But he has said a few words to us this season and I'm expecting him to get more and more vocal as the season goes on."

Davis said he just wants to contribute to the team's improvements.

"I'll just go out and rebound, score and block shots," he said. "I think that's what I do best for my team."
