CRISFIELD, Md. (AP) - When H. DeWayne Whittington claimed he was fired as school superintendent because he is black, the jury did more than just give him his good name back. It suggested the district

put that name on a school. On Wednesday, the district did just that, renaming Crisfield Primary School the H. DeWayne Whittington Primary School.


