Ditka confirms he will return to NFL to coach Saints

NEW ORLEANS (AP) — Mike Ditka confirmed he will return to the NFL as the new coach of the New Orleans Saints, saying "I'm going to climb the mountain one more time.

"It's going to be fun," Ditka said during Sunday's Super Bowl game, the Chicago Sun-Times reported.

Earlier Sunday, Ditka ran into one of his old Bears' quarterbacks, the Colt's Jim Har-

Chicago Tribune reported.

'He was happy, excited," Harbaugh told the Tribune. "He said, 'We're going to do it right this time," Harbaugh was quoted as saving.

A highly placed NFL source told The Associated Press that Ditka will become the Saints coach this week.

Asked while walking onto the field for the pregame ceremonies if he would like to coach

baugh, and talked about his new job, the the Saints, Ditka responded with a quick, 'Yes." After the ceremony, NFL officials rushed Ditka off, refusing to allow him to comment further.

Ditka, who quit his job as a television commentator on Saturday, was picked after general manager Bill Kuharich lobbied strongly for him, the NFL source said.

"Bill Kuharich has convinced (Saints owner) Tom Benson that Mike Ditka is the right man to

coach the Saints and help bring the crowds back to the Superdome," the source said.

Kuharich will remain with the team as president and general manager, according to

the source.

Kuharich did not return calls after messages were left on his answering machine on Sunday. Benson declined comment.

The announcement from the Saints was expected early in the week.


