small amount of h Nash glassware appeared, hand-fted, in limited edition in 1933. The art deco emphasis on the dern and new can be seen in sh's series, even in the stems of air of candlesticks modeled afskyscrapers.

More evidence of the "modern" appears in the form of an ashy fluted in the shape of a gear. Another of the Modern America es' pieces is a cubist cocktail ss. The glass uses cubist style d simple geometric shapes simi-to those Pablo Picasso and orge Braque made famous in r paintings

Even though the cocktail and ss swiftly became popular after erica's stint with prohibition, Great Depression caused a lack nterest and buyers. Conseently, the Nash line was forced shut down in 1935.

Another theme throughout the ss in the collection is that no ece has the characteristic little rsive "L" I was used to, and that de me feel somewhat better out the confiscation of my milk. It would not have been the me drinking experience without e little cursive "L," so I grabbed y milk before it got too warm and aded back to my dorm room. I think I will go back and spend ittle more time at the Libbey ass Company exhibit, but next ne I'm going to leave the milk d Nestle's Quik at home.

Hill said the most time-consuming aspect of blueprinting the plaque was making the decisions concerning which organizations and activities would go onto it.


"Everyone had to be given a chance," Hastedt said, "so the blue-print took a long time to do."

"Mother and Child Together" by Robert Schiffhauer is part of the collection "Exploring Boundaries" now on exhibit.




