Aggies fall in overtime

STAFF AND WIRE REPORT

Corey Brewer scored Oklahoma's final five points and the Sooners overcame a 12-point second-half deficit to beat Texas A&M 62-59 in overtime Tuesday night.

Oklahoma (13-6, 5-4 Big 12) won consecutive games for the first time since December. The Sooners got back into the game by holding Texas A&M (8-11, 2-7) scoreless for 6 1/2 minutes late in the second half, and won despite getting just six points from Nate Erdmann, whose 23.5 average in Big 12 games led the league.

"I thought we played well on Erdmann," A&M Head Coach Tony Barone said. "He is a great player. I think Brewer and Erdmann are the best combo of guards in the league."

The Aggies had a chance to win at the end of regulation, but Shanne Jones missed a point-blank shot with about two seconds remaining.

Tracey Anderson, who scored 21 for A&M, drove inside for a basket to start overtime. Then the Sooners

scored five in a row — three Brewer — to take the lead for good.

Brewer made two free throws with 8.5 seconds left to make a score 62-59, then the Aggies missed their final two shots.

Brewer finished with 19 points and was 9-of-12 from the floor. Erdmann didn't score after halftime when he was 0-of-5 from the floor.

Eduardo Najera, who had 11 points and 11 rebounds, scored back-to-back baskets to cap a run in which the Sooners turned 51-42 deficit into a 55-51 lead 2:27 to play. A&M committed turnovers and missed both its shots during that time.

But two free throws by Barone and a jump hook by Quesada tied the score at 55 with seconds left. The Sooners made two shots after that, the final one a pointer by Tim Heskett with seconds left.

The Aggies set up their final shot and Anderson made a nice layup inside to Jones, but he missed as Najera defended.

Mizzou knocks off Kansas

COLUMBIA, Mo. (AP) — Top-ranked Kansas ran out of great escapes Tuesday night.

Corey Tate picked up a loose ball near the free throw line and scored with 5.6 seconds to go in the second overtime — and two seconds left on the shot clock — as Missouri handed the Jayhawks their first loss of the season, 96-94.

Kelly Thames had 24 points and 11 rebounds and Derek Grimm had 20 points for Missouri (12-10, 4-6 Big 12). Grimm fouled out in the first overtime and Thames fouled out with 1:15 to go in the second overtime.

It was the second consecutive overtime game for Kansas, which hasn't played much like

the best team in the nation lately, especially with starting center Scott Pollard sidelined with a broken foot. Before this game Kansas (22-1, 8-1) survived an overtime scare from Nebraska on Saturday and had close calls against Texas Tech and Colorado before that.

On the game-winner, Tate Lee was stripped by Jason Vaughn when he attempted to drive the lane. Tate picked up the ball and didn't hesitate to fire.

After inbounding the ball, Kansas ran out of time before it could get a shot. Raef LaFrentz launched a pointer that was off the mark as the buzzer had sounded.

Against Kansas University, Linder has also made her presence known in the paint, ripping down a career-high 10 boards against Oklahoma State University. Her 3.8 rebound per contest ties her for the team with freshman guard Kera Alexander.
