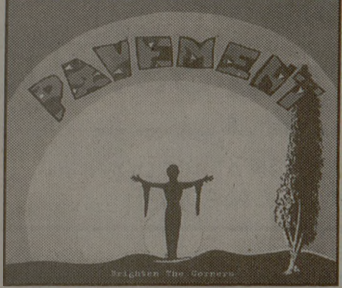

## Campus-to-campus shuttle starts today The Reveille bus route will no longer service the Blinn campus

Starting today, the new Texas A&M shuttle to Blinn will provide transportation service for students enrolled in both schools.

Prior to the new service, the off-campus Reveille bus route serviced the Blinn campus, making it the third to last stop. The entire route to and from A&M was allotted 36 minutes.

Michael Hutney, assistant manager for Shuttle Bus Operations, said the Blinn portion of the Reveille route is being discontinued. The Blinn campus will be serviced by its own shuttle.

"We're providing better service for Reveille patrons and still providing service to Blinn patrons as well," Hutney said.

The Blinn shuttle route will run Monday through Thursday, 7 a.m. to 6:30 p.m. The bus stop at Blinn will be located in front of the campus.

Because of Blinn's abbreviated class schedule on Fridays, the bus route's Friday hours will be shortened from 7 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.

The new bus stop is directly across from the on-campus Reveille bus stop on Hogg Street.

The Reveille bus will run in an eastbound direction while the Blinn shuttle will go in a westbound direction. The Centerpole bus route,

Jeremy Drager, a bus driver and senior cultural economics major, said many passengers complained the route took too long with the addition of the Blinn stop.

"It took an extra six minutes on the alternate route," Drager said.

He said it can be hard to decide where to keep the Blinn stop on the Reveille route make different routes instead.

"It's really trial and error on all these routes," Drager said. "You don't know what it's going to be like with all this traffic until you try it out."

Drager said only a handful of people were going to Blinn, and the addition of the new shuttle should clear up much confusion.

Jonathan Miller, a Reveille passenger and senior industrial engineering major, said though he thinks co-enrolled students should take responsibility for finding their own way, the new Blinn shuttle will be beneficial to Blinn students.

"It's nice for A&M to go out of their way to serve more co-enrolled students some convenient Miller said.

Rick Powell, coordinator for Student Legal Services, said a bartender charged with selling to a minor can face jail time or a fine. Bartenders are required to have Texas Alcoholic Beverage Commission certification through a course on alcoholic beverages.

In the class, bartenders learn about the effects of alcohol and when to stop serving someone.

A business can lose its liquor li-

cence or face sanctions such as fines, if found liable for misconduct of serving alcohol.

If Hurricane Harry's is found liable, it will lose its liquor license and may have to close down.

Kendall Bonds, a senior agronomy major, said he visits Hurricane Harry's often.

"I would hate to see Harry's shut down," Bonds said. "But action needs to be taken to prevent any incidents such as this from happening again."

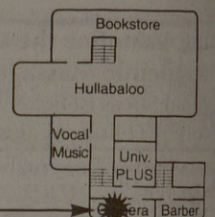
